Have you entered God's rest?

Genesis 2v1-3, Matthew 11v28-30, Hebrews 3v7-12, 4v1-11

- ➤ What things stop you from being able to rest (in the sense of being at peace)?
 - God's rest is the climax of creation: this is what we were made for

(1)God's rest

- satisfaction
 - complete
 - as it should be
- home [Exodus 40v33, Deuteronomy 12v9-11, Isaiah 66v1, Revelation 21v22]
- in himself...shared [Hebrews 4v1, 3]
- ▶7th day is holy because the people God made can now enter his rest
- ➤ "Genesis 2v2 tells us that God never does anything else in creation again." True or false? (*Hint*: see John 5v17, Ps 104v27).
- ➤ Where does God live? (a) as far from his creation as possible, (b) or as close to his creation as possible?
- ➤ What can the wicked (= those who don't know God) <u>not</u> have according to Isaiah 57v20?

(2) Jesus' rest

- offers rest [Matthew 11v28-30, John 17v26]
 - as God finished work! [John 17v4, 19v30, Hebrews 8v1, 10v12]
 - experienced as man [John 4v34, 5v30]
- ► The relationship Jesus has with his Father is shared with his disciples
- ➤ John 17v26: "...that the l _ _ _ you [Father] have for me [Jesus] may be in them [those who trust in Jesus]"

(3)Our rest

- in Jesus [Matthew 11v28, John 14v27, 16v33]
- not in works [Hebrews 4v10]
- day of rest
 - God's gift of time, ordered according to his pattern
 - at home with God
- ➤ What stops people entering into God's rest? (See Hebrews 3v11-12)
- ➤ In Genesis 1 God creates order in creation. What order does he create in time?

Questions for discussion:

- 1. *Augustine:* "We are made for God, and our hearts are restless until we find our rest in him." What evidence could you point to that shows the truth of what Augustine said?
- 2. What does it mean by "entering God's rest" (e.g. as we find in Hebrews 3 & 4)?
- 3. What is an unbelieving heart (Hebrews 3v12)? Why does it stop us entering God's rest?
- 4. How as Christians can we miss out on enjoying God's rest?
- 5. Why should we have a day of rest?
- 6. What makes the "Lord's day" special?
