OUR FOCUS

e-Origins is an open-access, electronic journal that disseminates the results of constructive creationist model-building and research in an accessible way. We publish articles, book reviews and opinion pieces ranging across multiple disciplines, including theology, science, philosophy and education. Articles are based on scholarly work yet written in a way to be accessible to non-experts. We do not ordinarily publish articles solely focused on criticism of evolution nor technical papers reporting original research. We encourage authors of technical papers to submit to existing peer-reviewed journals such as *Journal of Creation Theology and Science* [<http://www.coresci.org/jcts/index.php/index>], *Answers Research Journal* [<https://answersingenesis.org/answers/research-journal/>], *Journal of Creation* [<https://creation.com/journal-of-creation-articles>] or *Origins* [<http://grisda.org/resources1/origins/>].

OUR EDITORIAL AND REVIEW PROCESS

Although many articles will be specially commissioned by our editorial team, we will also consider unsolicited contributions. However, we advise prospective authors to submit an idea before writing a full article. Articles must be from a young-age creationist perspective, consistent with our stated focus and in agreement with our statement of faith [<http://www.biblicalcreationtrust.org/about-bct-statement-of-faith.html>]. All articles will be assessed for suitability and technical competence by at least one qualified reviewer before acceptance. Books will be carefully selected for review for their strategic significance to the origins debate. Authors in academically sensitive positions will be able to publish anonymously or using a pseudonym.

ARTICLE GUIDELINES

Articles should typically be no more than 2,500–3,000 words. Book reviews and opinion pieces should typically be no more than 800–1,200 words. Manuscripts should be single-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman. We encourage authors to submit visuals to accompany their article. Photographs should be copyright-free or the author's own. Other figures can be redrafted if necessary by our graphic designer. Figures and tables should be included at the end of the manuscript, preceded by a separate section of figure and table legends. Do not integrate figures or legends directly into the text.

Articles should include the following items (in order): The title of the paper, the names and affiliations of all authors and contact information (postal address, email

and telephone number) for the lead author. Authors should also submit a short biography (maximum 150 words).

References should be made by author-date parenthetical notation and listed alphabetically at the end of the paper (before the figure/table legends). References to books must include pages (e.g. Wise 2002, p.95). References should be in the following format:
